### Outreach

#### <u>Pantry</u>

On December 4, the final report for the Hillsdale County Community Foundation had been filed showing how the pantry utilized the \$2500 that it was awarded in December of 2012.

The food pantry partnered with Meijer in their Simply Give fund raising program during November and December and the first couple of days of January 2014. Funds raised through the program were matched and then placed on a gift card for the food pantry to use at the Meijer store.

In November, Pantry Director Kathy Blonde collected numerous \$10 donations and received \$900



from Metaldyne UAW members to turn in to Meijer during the two-day doublematch period. All funds donated and matched generated a total of \$4280 during the month of November. Early in 2014, there will be another gift card given to the pantry for the remainder of the donations that came in during the regular match period from December through January. 3. Pantry volunteers will watch for Meijer sales throughout the year and use the gift card judiciously to continue to

serve Hillsdale County residents who use the pantry. Thank you and bless all who gave to the food pantry during this fund-raising event and throughout 2013.

The food pantry also received a \$160 Market House gift card, thanks to the efforts of Mark Blonde who was instrumental in contacting Performance Auto of Jonesville. All donations to the LUMC Food Pantry are tax deductible.

There were many ways and forms of giving to our food pantry in 2013:

- The UMW donates items each month.
- Church members have their large family holiday gatherings and their members often bring items for the food pantry.
- Metaldyne UAW donated food in November.
- Girl Scouts collected food in October.
- The USPS had a can drive.
- The H.C.C.F. Youth had a Fill -the-Freezer drive.
- First Baptist Church has collected items for our pantry.
- Congregation members or locals from Litchfield share the bounties from their gardens.
- Bob Evans in Hillsdale donated meat.
- Hunters and farmers donate meat.
- Our local County National Bank allows us to have a food collection box in their lobby, too. CNB also donated over 30 coats this season which were given out through the pantry.
- Martha Wonders and others from the knit and crochet group are making mittens and hats which are given away, too.
- In December, Linda Knight donated a box of yarn for the craft group to continue knitting items to give away. (continued)

# **Outreach Continued**

The pantry is blessed with outpourings from many directions, which in turn, allow blessings to flow out to the families and individuals of our community who are in need.

Monetary donations are always welcome, too. Sometimes, due to the passing of a loved one, families and friends give memorial contributions to the food pantry. There are envelopes on the display table in the fireside room which can be used to send funds directly to the South Central Michigan Food Bank in Battle Creek, too. So many caring individuals, so many ways to give- we are thankful to be able to serve our community through the cycle of giving and receiving, in Jesus' name.

#### <u>Christmas Baskets</u>

This year, 23 Christmas baskets were given out. With the help of Tenneco, Brembo and NexSolutions who donated turkeys, and from individuals who donated items or money and from special collections, we were able to provide holiday meal items and a gift item for each child. Sixty individuals benefited from the holiday giving: 27 children and 33 adults.
