O Come This Night

Hundreds of years ago there was no Christmas celebration. The first three centuries had no calendar recognition of Christ's birth. It was declared by Origin (c.185-c.254) to be wrong to honor Christ the same as Pharoah and Herod. Birthdays were for pagan gods. However, not all agreed that Christ's birthday shouldn't be celebrated. Actual records were seemingly lost and speculations abounded by leaders in those early centuries. January, March, April, May, and November months and days were all considered for His birth date. The December 25 choice already had pagan festivals regarding the 'birth of the unconquered sun' (Roman) and the birth of Mithras, the Iranian 'sun of righteousness' (Roman). Also, the winter solstice which celebrates the sun is at this same time of year.

“She gave birth to her first child, a son.” Luke 2:7

Christian celebration of His birth was confusing then. Just as it was then with confusing days, we see similarities in agreeing when Black Friday really begins. Is it the first Monday in November, The Saturday before Thanksgiving, Thanksgiving night, or the whole month of November? For some, this really raises the stress level in decision making. To be at Denny's for 3 a.m. Friday breakfast after Thanksgiving or leave the turkey at 6 p.m. Thanksgiving day?! Too much confusion.

So in the 3rd century, enough was enough in debating when Christ's birth should be celebrated. With all those other celebrations occurring yearly, in the year 336, Emperor Constantine declared December 25 as Christmas, and that Christianity would be the empire's favored religion.

“Look at my servant. He is my chosen one... He will be gentle.”

Isaiah 42:1-2

Today in many ways, we, too, stretch that Christmas celebration throughout the month of December. Weekends are filled with choirs, parades, and gala events. Weekends are host to family gatherings, filled with music, travel, and shared meals. It is still calendar worthy to see that much of this confusion comes together on December 25, and Christ's birth is truly a celebration. Join in the month-long preparation! Join in the celebration!

On Wednesday afternoon, November 19, several people around the Litchfield area were tempted to start singing the “Hallelujah Chorus.” Rev. Julie Elmore received a message from the Albion District of the West Michigan Conference that our church’s grant application for the new sound system had been approved. The church will receive a \$5,000 grant in early December. With the grant, our church has raised \$18,625 toward new equipment. Hallelujah!

Rev. Julie contacted Craig Playford immediately to place the order. Mr. Playford began to work immediately on microphones, and it is likely the new sound board will be installed before Christmas. With new equipment issues that have developed since last summer, we also plan to purchase a new PowerPoint projector and CD player, which were not included in the original bid. New speakers, which were scheduled as part of Phase 3, may be delayed while other more pressing items are installed.

We praise God for all the support received for this project. Our prayer remains that this new equipment will allow our church to expand ministry opportunities in the Litchfield area. Thank you for helping us to achieve the goal, and may you receive many blessings for your faithfulness.
