## MAKING PLANS TO PURCHASE NEW SOUND SYSTEM

In recent years, the Litchfield United Methodist Church has experienced difficulty with its sound system in the sanctuary, which has affected the quality of services provided. Several technicians have repaired what they could. Now, vendors agree the system can no longer provide the quality audio and visual services that are necessary for our church and its ministries.

At its May 2014 meeting, the Administrative Council authorized the purchase of a new sound system from Playford Music & Sound of Jackson, Michigan, when funding is secured. Approximately \$18,000 is needed for the total package, however, the church could purchase equipment in phases, if necessary, as indicated below.

Phase 1 -- \$7,247.98 Phase 2 -- \$5,810.00 Phase 3 -- \$3,045.82 Labor Costs -- \$1,529.96 Total -- \$17,633.76

Our church facilities are used widely by the local church and the Litchfield community. A new mixer board and amplifiers are the first necessities. Updated computer equipment and software are needed to utilize modern media (e.g., iTunes and YouTube). Once again, we would be able to record services for those not able to be in attendance. Better hearing assistance devices would enhance the services for our seniors. Video monitors in the nursery, narthex, and fellowship hall would offer more people the opportunity to participate in worship. Likewise, these monitors would assist when overflow seating is needed.

The church is also used as a facility for services apart from regular Sunday worship times. Due to the size of the sanctuary and parking capabilities, our church is the site for weddings and funerals. Annually, the church sponsors a number of community-wide ministries for children. Teen events, movies, women's retreats, and singspirations are conducted from time to time. A functioning sound system is required for all of these gatherings.

Please begin to seek God's direction about making a gift for the Sound System Fund. Funding **must come above and beyond** our regular tithes and offerings. God has blessed our church richly over many years, and we want to serve God to the best of our abilities now. New sound equipment would enhance the opportunities for quality ministry.



Continue to increase worship attendance over the previous year.


# $\Rightarrow$ YEAR 5
