This year as a congregation, we have an opportunity to take a journey together as we focus on the "I Am" statements of Jesus through, *The God We Can Know*, by Rob Fuquay. This 7-week worship and study series will help us to grow in our Christian faith as we read about how Jesus helped us to deepen our understanding of him and God.

Jesus' "I Am" statements not only grab our imagination by revealing more about his purpose, they also shape our Christian identity and connect us to the God of Moses, the Great I Am. 

"I am the bread of life, no one who comes to me will ever be hungry again." John 6:35



Outreach Team-Letter from Paul Webster, our Missionary

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I just want to wish all of you a wonderful Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. We have several things to be very thankful for at Mujila Falls.

Number One: We have gotten very sizeable donations from churches that should enable us to buy a new John Deere Tractor and Disc Harrow in the coming weeks. I hope to go down to Lusaka in the coming week to work that out. This will insure that in 2015 we will be able to resume the planting of maize, soybeans, sorghum, etc. We have already made the purchase of the boom sprayer, and we have successfully gotten our IH tractor running again. Two tractors on site will insure that we won't be caught without one working tractor in the future.

Number Two: Many of you used the Giving Tuesday Advance Special matching grants to successfully bring us over \$12,000.00 in additional funds for Mujila Falls. This is a great pleasure after our failure last year to gain any funding from Giving Tuesday.

Number Three: We have ordered another 1200 layer chicks and 500 broiler chicks to renovate our poultry projects. This was one of Tshala's responsibilities and I am sort of "reinventing" the wheel as I go around making purchases. There are a lot of things to buy and transport to make it all happen.

Number Four: I am continuing to get the Toyota Landcruiser back in shape as we have to pass Road Fitness Testing in the coming week and then licensing and insurance for the coming year.



Number Five: We had a short, but productive, visit from my Area Secretary, Mande, from General Boad of Global Ministries where he was able to tour Mujila Falls and fully understand our need for additional missionaries to do farm management and special projects such as forestry, gardening, poultry, field crops, ox training, milking goats, small animals, etc.

We have had to go through a lot of re-adjustments since the death of Tshala Mwengo in April. I am so happy that I have had such great support from our staff at Global Ministries as well at all of the churches and conferences Andre and I visited this last summer. I apologize that I wasn't able to get into those conferences where Tshala and Betty traditionally have visited. I hope you will continue to make Tshala's dreams come true. Perhaps a new American Missionary Couple can be found in the Illinois, Indiana and Ohio Conferences in the near future to take up the mantle dropped by Tshala.

At this time, we are reminded of the great gift given at Christmas and pray that the Holy Spirit will come into our hearts and the Joy and Peace of Jesus Christ can be ours now and forever more.

2014 Financial Report

The Finance Team is pleased to report the Litchfield United Methodist Church was successful in its finances for 2014. A financial report was presented to the Administrative Council at its January meeting.

During the year, \$95,817 was received in unrestricted income for the church, while operating expenses totaled \$98,889. We were able to meet our expenses because of a surplus from the previous year. In addition, \$80,672 was received for designated projects, such as food pantry, ministry shares, sound system, and missions. We are pleased to report that all bills were paid for the year, including 100 per cent of our church's ministry shares. Praise the Lord! Thank you for your faithfulness to the ministries of Litchfield UMC.

Looking ahead to 2015, a projected budget of about \$110,000 has been prepared. The good news is that in 2014, 24 individuals or families pledged financial support totaling \$51,304. In 2015, 31 individuals or families made pledges totaling \$66,564. Thank you again for your commitments, as God provides. We also appreciate the many who contribute to the church on a regular basis, but do not make a pledge of their financial support.

The trustees are planning to make some upgrades to the parsonage, including purchasing a new furnace and replacing the roof. Let's begin praying together now that that financial need will be met. We know God provides!

Pew Bible Fund Established

Have you noticed the Bibles in the pews of our sanctuary are looking worn? Several members of the congregation have approached Pastor Julie about new Bibles. The topic was discussed at the January meeting of the Nurture/Witness Team. The team decided preliminary research was needed and then a recommendation would to be taken to the Ad Council.

The Common English Bible and the New Revised Standard versions were used for pricing information. Approximately 125 Bibles will be needed for the pews, and a few large-print editions should also be considered. Each Bible costs between \$8.50 and \$12.00. The total cost, at today's prices, would range between \$1,200 and \$1.700.

The following week, the Administrative Council voted to establish a Pew Bible Fund. A small committee will be appointed to work with the Pastor to select the Bibles and coordinate other details when sufficient funding is raised.

Anyone can now make donations to the fund, and Please indicate the designation on your check or on your gift envelope. Perhaps this would be a way some will want to give a memorial gift or a gift in honor of a loved one. Progress reports will be given from time to time. There is no timeline when new Bibles will be purchased.
