We held two sessions of Good Stuff Club in the spring and fall for children in Kindergarten through Sixth Grade. We had another successful Easter egg hunt and distributed treats at Halloween. We honored several high school graduates at the end of May and then in August had a wonderful week of Vacation Bible School in partnership with the Litchfield Congregational Church, reaching many more children in our community than in the previous year. We also resurrected a youth group that meets twice a month. Our food pantry continues to serve many families in our community and county. Christmas baskets were distributed to several families in our community, thanks to enormous support from members and friends at our chili supper and pie auction. As a congregation we even raised the necessary funds for a new sound system in which a new soundboard and microphones have already been installed. Four new members joined the church this year – one by transfer and three by profession of faith!!! We even paid 100% of our Ministry Shares, which connects us in mission to other United Methodists locally and globally!! New initiatives were distributing goodie boxes to our local farmers during harvest, then to our local school staff right before Christmas, and to local workers on Christmas Eve. There is so much more that could be listed. God has truly been working through our congregation!!

It has been quite a year, and we have much to look forward to in the year to come. God continues to call us to be faithful not only in working on our own spiritual growth, but also in reaching out and witnessing to our faith in our community. How wonderful it would be to continue these seasoned and newer opportunities, as well as to discern how else God is calling us to communicate God's love to those around us!! Additionally, how can we get more and more people inside and outside the congregation involved with these ministries?? Reflecting over the last year and looking ahead to the possibility makes me even more excited and blessed to be your pastor at this time. There is so much hope for our future!

May our prayer throughout this year be one of petition that God would show us how God would have us continue to live and serve faithfully.

Happy New Year!! The Litchfield Food Pantry got a welcome infusion of cash in its account at the South Central Michigan Food Bank in Battle Creek after a grant submitted to the Hillsdale Community Foundation on October 31, 2014 was approved in early December 2014 for \$2,500. We are ever so grateful for this support which allows us to continue to purchase foods from the Food Bank and serve our county's families.

Other good news: The Food Pantry received a check for \$400.32 from the Fire Department, proceeds from their pancake supper on December 6, when the city celebrated the lighting of the Christmas Lights in the park. # **HOLD THESE DATES FOR 2015!**



January 12: Bishop Deborah L. Kiesey would like to continue a conversation with the people of the Michigan Area, which she began more than two years ago by hosting a series of conversation events across the area. These events began in November and will be held in five United Methodist Churches. These events are open to any and all United Methodists who would like to enter into this dialogue about the creation of a new conference for the Michigan Area. Bishop Deb will come prepared to share her thinking around this possibility but wants you to know that she really wants to hear from you: your concerns, your hopes, your dreams. If we were to start from scratch and design a new

conference to enable churches from across the area to make disciples for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, what might be some of the things you would like to include? What might we want to do differently from the ways we have always done them? What strengths do we, as an annual conference, bring to the table?

This is your chance to speak with and hear from our Episcopal leader. Please let Pastor Julie know if you are interested in participating in this event. The event closest to us is on January 12, in Grand Rapids at Cornerstone UMC from 6:30 until 8:00 pm. A webinar for this session is also in the works which means that we will not have to travel to Grand Rapids to participate. Details to follow.

<u>February 7:</u> District Training Day & Conference. It is time to register for the Albion District Day & District Conference at Marshall United Methodist Church on Saturday, February 7. Doors open at 8:30 am and the official start to the day is 9:00 am. The day will conclude after District Conference about 3:30 pm. The theme for the event is "GETTING BETTER TOGETHER" – strengthening our local congregation and strengthening connections between local congregations. Our keynote speaker will be Rev. Benton Heisler, Director of Connectional Ministries for our West Michigan Conference.
