A Note From Pastor Julie

Summer is here – well unofficially since Memorial Day, but officially begins on June 21 at 12:38 pm EST according to the Farmer's Almanac! After another snowy winter and a relatively cool spring, it's time to enjoy all that summer has to offer, including picnics, excursions to your favorite ice cream shop, outdoor swimming, camping, water sports, boating, watching beautiful sunrises and sunsets, and lemonade on the very hottest days! Recently, David, Oliver, and I took our first kayaking venture of the year with a friend on the Kalamazoo River between Hanover Rd. and Folks Rd., somewhere between Litchfield and Concord. In addition, I got to watch 18-month-old Oliver simply enjoy himself, taking in all his surroundings, and watching bigger kids kayak and canoe with their parents.

Later, I found myself wondering what other parts of life and the world many (myself included) do not see and experience because the journey may be too time consuming or take more effort than usual. God is all around us, reminding us to take time to truly be in God's presence at all times, in all that we do. Sometimes when we look up from our norm and focus on what "seems" so important at the time, God reminds us that the true focus of our hearts and minds is serving God and others, as well as being in the presence of the Lord.

The Litchfield United Methodist Church has been invited to participate in an opportunity called Vital Church Initiative "Phase 1," which will begin in January 2016. Vital Church Initiative (VCI) is a process with resources, tools, suggestions, and support that helps congregations move forward (from wherever they are), becoming better Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World. Litchfield UMC is one of a limited number of

churches that have been invited to explore this opportunity because leaders in the Albion District sense that Litchfield UMC is already demonstrating vitality and showing a potential to continue to grow and learn. Being invited to be part of this opportunity is a compliment to our church leadership and congregation!

At their May 2015 meeting, the Administrative Council voted to participate in a special three-session event in Fall 2015 to help us evaluate our own "Ministry Potential and Vitality" before beginning VCI. These sessions will build upon each other and help us do some very healthy looking at ourselves and reflecting. We will be doing so in the company of other churches in the Albion District that are doing the very same thing. Attending this three-session event does not obligate us to go forward with VCI Phase 1.
