A Note From Pastor Julie

He's also smiling more than ever! Although we are generally excited whenever Oliver reaches a new milestone, David and I constantly have to readjust how we have always done things as a couple in order to adapt to the changes in Oliver's development! I'll be honest it is frustrating when Oliver gets into my make-up drawer and I cannot find things when I need them because we have not yet had the chance to baby proof that particular drawer! However, in the midst of Oliver keeping us on our toes with the baby proofing, many blessings are pouring forth! Some of those blessings are that he is on-track in his development; we get to experience the joy of making fun memories as a family, and to see God's creation right before our very eyes!!

When a church grows, just like when a child does, readjusting to a new normal is constant. Several weeks ago in a sermon, I mentioned that Litchfield UMC saw a 7% increase in worship attendance in 2014 over 2013. We have had an increase of 5 members in our congregation since a year ago at this time with the potential of even more. There were 25 people in attendance at our first Lenten study on February 23, with many new people participating over last year! There has also been an increase in the number of people attending adult Sunday School! We have resurrected a youth group, increased in participation in Junior Church, and have more kids in the nursery. Little by little pieces of our sound and multi-media systems are being installed and implemented which opens more possibilities in how we worship each week. We are in the midst of exciting times as our church is experiencing growth once again! This is not just growth in the number of participants, but also growth spiritually!! Praise God for all of this!

In the midst of all this growth, there are going to be times of change. Sometimes change is going to come quickly and other times change is going to happen slowly. Sometimes the changes are going to ruffle feathers and other times changes are going to happen naturally. Whatever the case may be, as Sisters and Brothers in Christ in the community of faith called Litchfield United Methodist Church, we must be patient with one another and in prayer for one another in the midst of these changes. We must also be patient with and in prayer for ourselves. We cannot always expect things to go smoothly. We cannot always expect things to go our way. Those of you who have been part of our church for a long time will experience change as you welcome and incorporate newer people. Those of you who have only just begun attending our church are already in the midst of change as you learn everyone's name and what church means right now in our context. Those of you in places in between continue to experience change as you learn, welcome, and incorporate. Ultimately, the church is God's church, and we are called to be faithful to God and God's plan for Litchfield UMC.

One thing I am personally working on this Lenten season is having more patience. I have found that I personally want things to be perfect right away and get annoyed when the change is a longer process than I expected. Maybe I'm a product of my generation who does not even know what life was like before microwaves. No, I really do not think so. As humans in general, our instinct is to want things now! However it's not about us, but about glorifying God and honoring how God is leading us to take the next faithful step in our lives together as we lead others to Christ and grow deeper in our own faith.





March of Penguins

Baby, it's cold outside! This year the Northeast states can check the 'YES' box for winter arrival! It's cold in other parts of the world, as well, including places such as Antarctica. But give the earth a bit of a tilt and from November to March, it is 'summer' at Port Lockroy on Goudier Island, coastal Antarctica. Summer there is still very cold compared to summer here. Even there nature has a way to show us the circle of life.

A recent program "NATURE", aired on PBS (Public Broadcast System) WKAR, East Lansing. It documented birds of that Island, visiting tourists, and the staff operating the facility/post. Penguins. Plenty of Penguins gather, pair up, mate, raise one or two chicks, nurture, grow and mature. What was most interesting from that filming? People did not interfere with the laws of



nature. Penguins had their own boundaries with imaginary fence lines and defended those territories from other penguins of the same breed. You'd think they'd get along, especially in such a harsh environment—harsh to people anyway.


